Council Highlights from October 23, 2023 **Regular Council Meeting**

- First Reading was given to Bylaw 013-2023: Land Use Bylaw amendment for small homes and Hens.
- · A temporary seasonal parking ban was approved on 45 & 46 Street on 52nd Ave. on the south side of the street (across from Bar-V-Nook) while Administration works with Smoky Lake Foundation to determine permanent parking solutions.
- Smoky Lake Town Council approved hosting an appreciation BBQ for the Town's volunteer firefighters on October 30, 2023.
- · Karen Chipchar, Ela Kozakiewicz and Lori Tychkowsky were re-appointed to the Smoky Lake Library Board for a term of three years.

- Six new FCSS Board Members were appointed: Pat Mallet-Ramsum, Fran Byers, Sacha Henry, Dominique Céré, Tegan Scharff and Sharon Boychuk.
- The Town has requested that Evergreen Waste Management Commission apply for the Extended Producer Responsibility program for the Smoky Lake Region. This places the responsibility of recycling on producers.
