

HUTSULSHCHYNA

Kosiv is known as the center of the Hutsul region. This region is an important center of Hutsul folk culture and crafts. From time immemorial, Hutsulshchyna has been known for its original crafts and decorative and applied arts: ceramics, woodcarving, the classics of which were the Shkriblyak, Dutchak, and Devdyuk dynasties, Easter eggs, weaving, embroidery, metal, wool, leather, beads, and horn, cheese, etc. Hutsul wooden churches are also famous.




Hutsul pottery is a traditional folk Hutsul craft, one of the types of ceramics. Pottery: various tableware, children's toys, souvenirs, stove tiles, decorative tiles.



CARVING

Hutsul wood carving stands out among many types of carving. Its characteristic feature is a combination of flat-relief and contour carving. The background is textured or selected. They differ significantly in terms of technological features from carving techniques of other regions.



LASER CARVING

In modern conditions, laser cutting is a high-tech, ultra-precise and very productive method of complex cutting, which makes it possible to manufacture various parts with any shaped contour. Thanks to the special properties of laser cutting, it is possible to make an accurate cut of any materials - plastic, wood, plywood, MDF, cardboard, etc., while the edge remains equal, clear even in the process of manufacturing products with a complex contour. Laser cutting and engraving significantly facilitates the work in the production of outdoor advertising, as well as significantly expands the possibilities for the production of various types of signs, POS products (stands, number plates, souvenir products, accessories), interior elements.





TRADITIONAL CLOTHES

Traditional clothing The main material for Hutsul clothing was home-spun woolen cloth, fur and domestic sheepskin. But the components of traditional Hutsul clothing, including festive and ceremonial ones (such as Carpathian wedding wreaths made of goose feathers), had rich ornamentation, ornaments, embroidery, appliqué, embossing on the skin, and metal products. There were special and various applications for clothes (axe, leather bag, tobivka, wallet, women's neck jewelry, etc.).

VYSHYVANKA DAY

World Vyshyvanka Day is an international holiday designed to preserve ancient folk traditions of creating and wearing ethnic embroidered Ukrainian clothing. The date of the event is every year on the third Thursday of May[1][2]. The holiday is not tied to any state or religious one. Anyone can join it by wearing an vyshyvanka
