




Living in The Town of Smoky Lake



ABOUT THE TOWN OF SMOKY LAKE

Smoky Lake is located in the west of the Alberta HUB region. Alberta HUB is a partnership of communities, business/industry and post-secondary educational institutions in Northeastern Alberta meant to enhance the quality of life and economic interests of this region. Agriculture is the economic base of the Smoky Lake area, and the major business sector in town is focused on providing agricultural services to the region. Smoky Lake is surrounded by many lakes and streams, along with the North Saskatchewan River. Smoky Lake was incorporated as a village in 1923 and received town status in 1962. Smoky Lake is perfect for an active lifestyle. We take pride in how clean and friendly our small town is with its wonderful businesses and dedicated volunteers who make the town a safe and enjoyable place to live. Noted as the Pumpkin Capital of Alberta and home to the only Métis Cultural interpretative centre in Alberta, Métis Crossing.



The Town of Smoky Lake is a member of the Northeast Alberta Information HUB, which is the regional economic development alliance for Northeast Alberta.





Healthcare

Smoky Lake Primary Care Network provides home care, speech-language pathology, community health nursing, hereditary disease, environmental health, nutrition, dental, Alberta Aids to Living, family life and health promotion programs. George McDougall Memorial Health Centre located in Smoky Lake, has acute care beds, 24-hour emergency services, laboratory and diagnostic imaging, and a full range of community-based services. Smoky Lake is also served by medical clinics, a nursing home with 56 continuing care beds, and a full range of senior citizen housing.



Education

Smoky Lake is served by the Aspen View Regional and Lakeland Catholic School Divisions, and offers a wide range of educational options:

- H.A. Kostash Public School (K to 12)
- Holy Family Catholic School (Preschool to Grade 9) in Waskatenau
- Vilna Public School (K-12) in Vilna
- Post-secondary: Portage College nearby in the Town of St. Paul, Lac la Biche and Boyle.



Housing

The Town of Smoky Lake is an excellent place to call home and a great place to do business. Twelve new fully serviced lots on level ground are now ready for development in a new subdivision in Smoky Lake with some backing on to picturesque municipal reserve parkland with a ravine. The lots range from 3,229 sq ft. to 8,611 sq. ft and are \$40,000.00 including service hook ups and road frontage. Community Services

The Town of Smoky Lake offers a wide variety of services, organizations and clubs that help to support, strengthen and bring our community together. We have full 911 service with:

- Fire Protection: experienced volunteer fire department equipped with two engines, rescue truck, 3-ton and 1-ton bush trucks.
- Police Services: served by a local detachment of the RCMP.
- Ambulance Services: Smoky Lake ambulance service; Associated Ambulance, which provides Advanced Life Support services.



Recreation

Recreation facilities in Smoky Lake include a curling rink, arena, halls, skatepark, spraypark, RV Park, children's playgrounds and a senior citizens' centre. Also, there is the Smoky Lake Golf Course, a nine-hole course nestled in the White Earth Valley and the Bellis Natural Area - a 16 square km area characterized by sand dunes, jack pine forests, sloughs and small lakes. Activities for the kids are plentiful with the Smoky Lake School of Dance and various sports including hockey. H.A. Kostash School offers archery and hunting mentorships. Smoky Lake is also the Western Gateway to the Iron Horse Trail, a recreation corridor that is part of the Trans Canada Trail. It offers endless kilometres of trail for cyclists, hikers, ATV's and horseback riders and in the winter months cross country skiing and snowmobiling.
